

Biblical Languages Concentration

Revised August 19, 2009

The Biblical Languages concentration focuses on both Old Testament Hebrew and New Testament Greek, and attempts to give students a solid base of knowledge and competence in these areas. It is particularly suitable for those who intend to pursue doctoral studies in Bible, or who desire to teach biblical languages. In this concentration, two years of both languages are required, and language study at the advanced level or within the context of advanced exegetical courses is recommended. Although a firm grasp of both Hebrew and Greek is required, one of these languages will serve as a focus within the concentration and additional work in this language will be expected.
