

# NOTES FOR FALL 2010 COURSES

(Updated June 21, 2010)

Most courses will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Note that since all courses have a limited capacity (whether due to classroom size or the nature of the course), students are strongly advised to *register early* to increase their chances of getting the courses they want. When registering in a course that has more than one section (e.g., Greek or Hebrew), students should indicate a second choice in case their first choice is full.

**CREDIT VALUE:** All courses are for 3 credit/audit hours only, unless otherwise indicated. Students who audit a variable credit course will register for the lowest number of audit hours for that course.

**PREREQUISITES (PRE) & RECOMMENDED PREREQUISITES (REC):** Students who lack a prerequisite (Pre) for a course will only be permitted to register for that course if they can provide the instructor's written permission. Students who lack a recommended prerequisite (Rec) will be permitted to register, but they should be prepared to do additional work in the course.

**Note:** Biblical Exegesis & Interpretation (BIBL 503) requires some knowledge of both Hebrew and Greek. For students who have taken Introductory Hebrew or Greek rather than LANG 500 (Perspectives), basic study notes are available for gaining some familiarity with the other language (see the Schedules & Forms page of the College website). These students may also audit the relevant half of LANG 500 in the Fall at a discounted audit rate of \$100, if they plan to take BIBL 503 in the Winter term.

**PRIORITY ENROLLMENT COURSES:** The courses listed below are each required for a program and have a limited enrollment due to the nature of the course (seminars typically have a maximum of 12 students). **Students wanting to take any of these courses must register by the early registration deadline of August 20, 2010 and attach a *Priority Enrollment Course Request Form* (available at Student Services and on the College website) to their *Fall Registration Form*.** Class lists will be determined within two weeks after August 20<sup>th</sup>, and students who have registered by this date will be notified by email shortly thereafter. Students who need a course for the program to which they have been admitted, and who have registered by the early registration deadline, will be given first priority. Note that courses numbered 700 or higher are for more advanced students and that seminars are not available to auditors.

**CHRISTIAN THOUGHT & CULTURE I (INDS 501):** Students taking Christian Thought & Culture I (INDS 501) for credit must also submit a *CTC Tutorial Request Form* with their *Fall Registration Form* by the early registration deadline (August 20, 2010), ranking ALL of their tutorial time preferences from among the options listed on the form (tutorials are not available to auditors). Students who intend to take CTC II (INDS 502) in the Winter term will be asked to remain in the same tutorial section they attended in the Fall term. CTC I students are strongly advised to submit their *Tutorial Request Form* early to increase their chances of getting into a desired section. Tutorial groups will be determined within two weeks after August 20<sup>th</sup>, and the results will be posted at the College and on the Regent website under Schedules & Forms.

**MDiv: SOUL OF MINISTRY / SUPERVISED MINISTRY:** All newly-admitted MDiv students, and returning MDiv students who have not completed **Soul of Ministry (APPL 500)** in a previous year, should plan to register for Soul of Ministry in Winter Term 2011 and plan to complete Supervised Ministry (APPL 690) in the following year (Fall Term 2011 and Winter Term 2012). Returning MDiv students who have completed Soul of Ministry (APPL 500) should register for **Supervised Ministry (APPL 690)** in Fall Term 2010 and Winter Term 2011 (1.5 cr. per term). The course consists of a Practicum and 8 Class sessions (4 per term). The Fall Term class has an Orientation on Sep 13<sup>th</sup> (10:30-12:00). Group 1 meets at 1:00-2:30 on Sep 13, Oct 4, Nov 1, Nov 29; Group 2 meets at 1:00-2:30 on Sep 20, Oct 18, Nov 8, Dec 6. See course syllabus for further details.

**MCS FIELD EDUCATION (APPL 691) / MCS MARKETPLACE FIELD IMMERSION (APPL 692):** MCS Field Education (APPL 691) consists of a Practicum and 8 Class sessions (4 per term). Students register for 1.5 credits per term. The class meets on Sep 27, Oct 25, Nov 15, Dec 13, Jan 24, Feb 21, Mar 14, Apr 11. Students taking MCS Marketplace Field Immersion (APPL 692) likewise register for 1.5 credits per term and arrange a practicum. **Major Project Orientation:** The Thesis Orientation (GENR 301) meets on Mondays, Sep 13, 20, 27, Oct 4, and costs \$35; the Integrative Project in the Arts and Theology Orientation (GENR 313) meets on Friday, Sep 17 and has no charge;

**Academic Writing:** (GENR 311) meets on Friday, Sep 17, from 1:00-4:00, & Saturday, Sep 18, from 9:00-4:00, and costs \$35;

students may arrange to meet individually with the instructor throughout the term.
