

NOTES FOR WINTER 2008 COURSES

(Updated: January 14, 2008)

Most courses will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Note that since all courses have a limited capacity (whether due to classroom size or the nature of the course), students are strongly advised to **register early** to increase their chances of getting the courses they want. When registering in a course that has more than one section (e.g., Greek or Hebrew), students should indicate a second choice in case their first choice is full.

CREDIT VALUE: All courses are for 3 credit/audit hours only, unless otherwise indicated. Students who audit a variable credit course will register for the lowest number of credit hours for that course.

PREREQUISITES: Students who lack a prerequisite for a course will only be permitted to register for that course if they can provide the instructor's written permission. Students who lack a recommended course will be permitted to register, but they should be prepared to do additional work in the course (Pre = Prerequisites; Rec = Recommended).

Note: Biblical Exegesis & Interpretation (BIBL 503) will require some knowledge of both Hebrew and Greek. One language course is required. For students who have taken Introductory Hebrew or Greek, basic study notes are available for gaining some familiarity with the other language (see the Schedules & Forms page of the College website).

LIMITED ENROLLMENT COURSES: The courses listed below are each required for a program and have a limited enrollment due to the nature of the course (seminars typically have a maximum of 12 students). **Students wanting to take any of these courses must register by the early registration deadline of December 14, 2007 and attach a *Limited Enrollment Course Request Form* (available at Reception and on the College website) to their *Fall Registration Form*.** Class lists will be determined within two weeks after December 14th; students who have registered by this date will be notified by email shortly thereafter. First priority will be given to students who need the course for the program to which they have been admitted. Note that courses numbered 700 or higher are for more advanced students and that seminars in particular are not available to auditors.

CHRISTIAN THOUGHT & CULTURE II (INDS 502): Students who took CTC I (INDS 501) in the Fall term are asked to remain in their same tutorial section for CTC II (INDS 502) in the Winter term. Students who must change tutorial sections due to an unavoidable scheduling conflict will need to appeal to the CTC Administrative TA in the first week of class. Students newly admitted in the Winter term are advised to wait until the subsequent Fall & Winter term to begin taking Christian Thought & Culture I & II. **However, new students who decide to take CTC II for credit in Winter term must submit a *CTC Tutorial Request Form* with their *Winter Registration Form* by the early registration deadline (December 14, 2007), indicating their top three preferences among the twelve tutorial sections listed.**

Up to the first day of the term, students formally admitted to the College will be given priority over Unclassified students who were not registered in CTC I in the Fall. Unclassified students who did not take CTC I in the Fall, and all students auditing CTC II, will be waitlisted until available space is determined in the first week of class.

MDiv: Soul of Ministry Forum, I, & II / Supervised Ministry:

All MDiv students admitted under the 2007-2008 Academic Catalogue, and all MDiv students admitted under a previous catalogue who have not taken any Supervised Ministry, will register for the following sequence of courses:

- Year One / Winter Term: Soul of Ministry I Class (APPL 500; 2 credits), Tuesdays, 6:30 to 9:30 pm. MDiv students who begin in Winter Term must register for the Soul of Ministry Forum (APPL 301; 0 credits) and the Soul of Ministry I Class (APPL 500).
- Year Two / Winter Term: Supervised Ministry (APPL 690); Class & Practicum; Students register for the final 1.5 credits.

MCS Field Education / MCS Marketplace Field Immersion:

MCS Field Education (APPL 691), which began in the Fall term, continues in the Winter term with a Practicum & 4 remaining class sessions on Jan 16, Feb 20, Mar 12, & Apr 9. Students register for 1.5 credits in the Fall and Winter term.

MCS Marketplace Field Immersion (APPL 692) students likewise register for their final 1.5 credits and continue with their practicum in the Winter term.

Non-Credit Courses:

Major Project Orientation: The Thesis Orientation (GENR 301) meets on Jan 24, 31, Feb 7, & 21, and costs \$35; the Integrative Project in the Arts and Theology Orientation (GENR 313) meets on Jan 18 and has no charge;

Academic Writing: (GENR 311) meets on Jan 25, from 1:00-4:00; & Jan 26, from 9:00-4:00, and costs \$35; students may arrange to meet individually with the instructor throughout the term.
