## **Course Description**

Calvin's theology is widely believed to consist of the famous (or notorious) 'Five Points', and nothing more. In this Course we shall consider other important aspects of Calvin's thought that are neglected but have similar importance and interest – the knowledge of God and of ourselves (the main motif of the Institutes); his Catholic Christianity; his account of God's double gift, justification and sanctification; the two kingdoms and the significance of human culture; and God's providence and fatalism.

Monday, June 9 Calvin: the man and his style

The knowledge of God and of ourselves

Tuesday, June 10 Calvin's catholic Christianity

Wednesday, June 11 The two-fold gift

Thursday, June 12 God's providence and fatalism

Friday, June 13 The two kingdoms and culture

### **Assignments**

1. Reading

All students will read the following:

- Paul Helm's Calvin, A Guide for the Perplexed chapters 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7
- Selections from John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion, preferably translated by Henry Beveridge. The selections are Book I. 1-5, Book I. 13, Book I 16-18, Book II 13-16 and Book III 19

Two-credit students will also read Paul Helm's John Calvin's Ideas.

<u>Note:</u> The reading is to be, first of all, the primary texts from the Institutes and then secondary reading. Please prioritize and take your time with the primary texts.
