COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will consider major themes and texts tied to the biblical theology of Luke-Acts. It will also discuss method and compare thinking biblically theologically in comparison to thinking in systematic theological terms.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon the successful completion of this course, students should have a clearer understanding of:

- 1. To articulate major themes in Luke-Acts theology
- 2. To tie key texts to key themes tied to promise, Christology and salvation
- 3. To present how to do biblical theology with narrative, keeping an eye on both themes and narrative progression.

- Day 2 Jesus: Narrative Sequence, Person and Work; The Spirit in Luke-Acts
- Day 3 Salvation; Israel and the Gentiles; The Church in Luke/Acts
- Day 4 Ethics and Discipleship; Opponents, Crowds, Rome; Women, the Poor, and Others in Luke/Acts
- Day 5 The Law & Scripters; Eschatology in Luke/Acts; Luke and the Canon/Reading
