INDS/SPIR 558: ICONS IN PRAYER AND WORSHIP

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This brief but intensive study will center on the splendor of the Uncreated Light that radiates through icons, engaging those who pray and worship with the presence of the incarnate God. Our focus will be on icons of various saints, as well as the chief events of Christ's life: his Nativity, his Presentation in the Temple, his Baptism or Theophany, his Transfiguration, his Entry into Jerusalem, his Crucifixion, his Resurrection and Ascension, as well as Pentecost. Much shall be made of the difference between Christian art before and after the Renaissance. Whereas the latter often produces magnificent images that we <u>look at</u>, the Icon tradition produces images that <u>look at us</u>. We shall see how they invite us into the life of radical transformation in Christ.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Students should take from this course a deepened appreciation for the ways in which the Icons of the Eastern church ground them more deeply in Scripture while enhancing their own life of prayer and worship. We will succeed to the extent that the Icons summon us to become personal and living icons of Christ.

COURSE OUTLINE

- **Day 1** Introduction to Icons, with emphasis on *Christ Pantocrator* (of Mt. Sinai), *Vladimir Mother of God*, and *Rublev's Abrahamic Trinity*
- Day 2 Annunciation Nativity, Baptism/Epiphany
- Day 3 Transfiguration, Entry into Jerusalem, Holy Supper, Crucifixion
- Day 4 Resurrection, Ascension, Descent of the Spirit
- Day 5 John the Forerunner, Raising of Lazarus, Dormition of the Mother of God, St. Xenia of St. Petersburg
