COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will focus on New Testament texts that bear on contemporary questions about sex and gender, marriage and singleness. Using contemporary concerns related to embodiment, sexuality, gender dysphoria and the like as a jumping off point, the course will seek to allow portions of the New Testament to speak to — and also query, subvert, and transform — some of our current ways of approaching and answering these questions.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon the successful completion of this course, students should have a clearer understanding of:

1. Understand and articulate some of the primary contemporary challenges for appropriating the New Testament's teaching on sexuality, gender, etc.
2. Appreciate more fully the subtlety and richness of New Testament texts having to do with sexuality, marriage, singleness, etc.
3. Communicate more effectively the challenges offered by the New Testament to contemporary Western societies' sexual and gender norms.
