BIBL/INDS 571: Silent No More: Women Interpreters of the Bible

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Through the centuries, women—nuns, mothers, mystics, preachers, teachers, suffragists, and household managers—interpreted scripture through their writings, art, and music. Their forgotten or neglected interpretations of the Bible deserve our attention. This course will examine how women have read and interpreted the Bible beginning with the period of the early church. It will include the writings of medieval visionaries, renaissance exegetes, and both early modern and modern women. It will focus particularly on women's interpretations of Genesis 1-3 and Pauline texts. It will raise questions about how to interpret the Bible faithfully today.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon the successful completion of this course, students should have a clearer understanding of:

- 1. Identify forgotten and silenced women's interpretations of the Bible through the centuries
- 2. Identify and explain methodological, exegetical, and hermeneutical issues raised by women interpreters as they engaged Scripture
- 3. Engage, expound, and critically assess the interpretive work of several interpreters of Scripture
- 4. Demonstrate how social setting, gender, culture, class, ethnicity, and age influences interpretation
- 5. Recognize the need to recover and include the voices of women in our accounts of history
