COURSE DESCRIPTION

Reflect on your leadership with a long-term focus on leading into a sustainable future. Focus on the relevance of Christ's teaching in the Beatitudes and learn from biblical leaders like Joseph and Daniel to strengthen your own vocation. Explore the power of leadership metaphors in an interactive, supportive learning environment that's open to and relevant for all leaders—whether seasoned or aspiring—in all spheres. Discern and consider the challenges and opportunities leaders felt during COVID-19, and learn how other leaders have responded well, led with courage, and brought their people with them. Come away refreshed and empowered to lead well.
