

BIBL 663: 갈라디아서 Paul's Letter to the Galatians

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May 22-26; 8:30am - 4:30pm

2 or 3 graduate credit hours; or 2 audit hour

COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this course, we will engage in an exegetical study of Paul's letter to the churches in Galatia, with particular attention to its literary structure, its theological themes, and its continuing significance for the Christian church. The historical and literary/rhetorical contexts will be explored with special attention to the problems of the Jewish laws applied to the Gentile Christians.

SPECIAL NOTE

This course is taught solely in Korean.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon the successful completion of this course, students should have a clearer understanding of:

1. Discuss the linguistic, literary, cultural, and historical background of Galatians
2. Summarize the content of Galatians and its theological significance
3. Review the current debate on the message of Galatians
4. Reflect on the implications of Galatians for faith and life today, especially on the missional call to share the gospel of God
