COURSE DESCRIPTION

Marketplace theology is good for the soul, the body and the workplace. But what is it? Modifying the enigmatic definition of theology made by the Puritan, William Perkins, we will explore marketplace theology as "the science of working blessedly forever." This takes us on a journey through the Scriptures and the history of theological reflection. We will deal with practical questions such as: Why work? What does work mean? What is the marketplace? And how can we bring transformation to our daily work, whether remunerated or not, as well as to the workplace and to the worker herself or himself?

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon the successful completion of this course, students should have a clearer understanding of:

- 1. Articulate for themselves a workplace theology that is biblical and contextual
- 2. Understand the breadth of investigation (head, heart and hands) needed to develop their own marketplace theology
- 3. Demonstrate growth in prayer and spirituality in their own work life
- 4. Be able to theologically reflect on and unpack workplace joys, experiences and challenges from a biblical perspective
